



CHEROKEE WMA OVERVIEW MAP

The Cherokee Wildlife Management Area is located in eight counties primarily in the Boston Mountains and Ozark Foothills. Habitat varies from upland hardwood, mixed pine/hardwood, to pine. This area offers hunting opportunities for deer, turkey, squirrel, quail, and other small game. Property boundaries are defined by orange paint. A leased land permit is required to hunt or trap the WMA. ATVs and ORVs (off road vehicles) use is restricted to hunting purposes as described in the Hunting Guidebook. Recreational riding is prohibited. Horses and mules may be used for hunting purposes; however, organized trail riding events are restricted to: open and maintained roads and dates other than October 1 through January 31 and April 1 through May 31. Events of more than ten horses or mules must be permitted. Dogs may be used to hunt rabbit and squirrel when no muzzleloader or modern gun deer season is open. Dogs may be used to hunt quail and raccoon. Gates are installed on some tracts and are closed March - September. Refer to hunting guidebook for specific details before hunting area.
